Modern media & communication



Course description.

This course introduces students to a number of writing strategies through the examination of modern media. It also introduces techniques for responding effectively to the writing of others and ways to identify genres and rhetorical strategies appropriate to various audiences, platforms and expected outcomes. Students will produce a variety of texts that explore the role of media in shaping communal discourses and individual identity using self-reflection and critical examination of how they engage with modern media on a daily basis.

Course assignments.

Class Activities

You will participate in various writing exercises, discussion board posts and timed writing quizzes that support course content and learning.

Writing Blog

Every week you will be required to practice reflexive writing and keep track of it in a private blog.

Paper 1: Media Quandary

For this paper you will write a 7- to 10-page expository paper that identifies and applies moral and legal issues related to communication media technology and communication professions.

Paper 2: Media Literacy Analysis

For this paper you will complete a media literacy critical analysis examining advertisements. You will write a 7- to 10-page analytical paper that will use the media literacy process described in your readings as an organizational outline.

Paper 3: Literature Review

For this paper, you will write a 5- to 7-page literature review where you will be asked to critically read, summarize, and synthesize academic scholarship on a topic of your choosing that you will also use for your final paper.

Paper 4: Media Analysis

You will learn media analytical tools over the course of the semester that you will be asked to apply in this analysis for a deeper



understanding of media messages and their impact on culture and society. This paper will be a minimum of 10 pages, excluding title page and reference section.

Peer Review

Over the course of the session, you will be assigned a peer review partner for which you will be responsible for providing thoughtful and critical feedback to help them improve their writing.

Course goals.

G1. Understand that writing is a dynamic means of communication that entails a process that emerges from and responds to specific rhetorical situations.

G2. Understand that writing shapes and is shaped by multiple social contexts that transforms the self and others and the choices writers make have ethical dimensions and implications.

G3. Know that genre awareness can serve as a guide in the composing process and that academic writing shares both common and discipline-specific characteristics and conventions, including those related to research and citation practices.

Learning objectives.

LO1. Demonstrate how to select the appropriate rhetorical mode for the audience of a written piece and its desired outcome.

LO2. Demonstrate how to critically read, summarize, paraphrase and interpret media texts in writing in order to use those ideas appropriately in your own work.

LO3. Demonstrate how to reflect upon your writing process and use that reflection to strengthen drafts and shape an effective final product.

LO4. Demonstrate how to select appropriate language, examples, and rhetorical strategies appropriate to the moral, economic, and cultural contexts of both the topic and the audience.

LO5. Demonstrate how to collaborate effectively with peers to develop, draft, and revise focused, well-organized, coherent, polished documents.

LO6. Demonstrate how to produce written work that uses appropriate rhetorical strategies specific to the purpose and medium of the assignment.
